 Pietas requires that a man should do what is due and right

City over Self

AENEAS RESPECTS THE GODS

- Listens to Venus & Hector Fall of Troy
- Brings Gods with him
- Chooses Fate over Self
- Listens to Jupiter (Mercury) and reacts with fear (healthy respect)
- Sacrifices to Juno obeys Tiber

AENEAS RESPECTS THE CITY

- Tries to save Troy
- Fights valiantly
- Saves the Trojans
- Brings Troy to Latium

AENEAS RESPECTS FAMILY

- Saves father and son
- Tries to save Creusa
- Leaves Carthage for Iulus

AENEAS RESPECTS FRIENDS

- Inspires his men
- 7 stags
- Proper burials
- Funeral games
- Vows to protect Pallas
- Avenges Pallas

AENEAS RESPECTS ENEMIES

- 12 day truce
- Tells Latins he is not their enemy
- Vows to leave if he loses to Turnus
- Vows that men will live as equals
- Almost forgives Turnus

AENEAS THE HERO

- Enters the Underworld a Trojan, emerges a Roman
- Badass warrior!!!!!
- Fights alongside/front of his men
- Human not perfect (Dido)

THE GODS

- Venus and Juno bickering
- Jupiter mostly neutral
- Mercury carries out orders
- Rumor
- Aeolus, Vulcan bribed
- Neptune, Tiber, nymphs helpful
- Juturna follows Juno
- · Diana Camilla

VENUS

- Does not care about Dido
- Doves
- Shield
- Deflects Spears

JUNO

- Aeolus storm
- Dido distraction
- Turnus shame
- Juturna uses her
- Allecto fury
- Sore loser???? Mostly destructive
- DOES win Latins will keep name and language

JUPITER

- Mostly neutral
- Does allow Juno to interfere when he sees Venus interfering
- Scales Turnus and Aeneas
